## Scriptures (NKJV)

### 1. How much does God know about what we do?

Hebrews 4:13, (Numbers 32:23, Psalm 90:8). “And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but               are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we *must give* account”

### 2. To whom are we responsible for our actions and their correction?

Psalm 32:5. “I acknowledged my sin to You, And my iniquity I have not hidden. I said, ‘I will confess my transgressions to the       ,’ And You forgave the iniquity of my sin.”

### 3. How may our sins be forgiven?

1 John 1:9. “If we        our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.”

## 10. What direction is given regarding confession of sin?

Numbers 5:5-7. “<sup>5</sup> Then the LORD spoke to Moses, saying, <sup>6</sup> ‘Speak to the children of Israel: When a man or woman commits any sin that men commit in unfaithfulness against the LORD, and that person is guilty, <sup>7</sup> then he shall confess the sin which he has committed. He shall make [redacted] for his

trespass [ ] [ ] plus [ ] of it, and give *it* to the one he has wronged.””

Psalms 51:1-4. “<sup>1</sup> Have mercy upon me, O God, According to Your lovingkindness; According to the multitude of Your tender mercies, [ ] [ ] my transgressions. <sup>2</sup> Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, And cleanse me from my sin <sup>3</sup> For [ ] [ ] [ ] [ ] , And my sin *is* always before me. <sup>4</sup> Against You, You only, have I sinned, And done *this* evil in Your sight—That You may be found just when You speak, *And* blameless when you judge.”
