1. What does God use to sanctify the life?

John 17:17 (NKJV). "Sanctify them by Your <u>truth</u>. Your <u>word</u> is truth."

2. How are we to live the Christian life?

John 15:4, 5 (NKJV). "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. ⁵ I am the vine, you *are* the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing."

3. How does one continue the beginning experience?

Colossians 2:6 (NKJV). "As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,"

2 Corinthians 5:17 (NKJV). "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new."

9. What promise does God make regarding your success?

Jude 24 (NKJV). "Now to Him who is able to keep you from stumbling, And to present you faultless Before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy,"

10. How are we to be transformed?

Romans 12:2 (NKJV). "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the <u>renewing</u> of your <u>mind</u>, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

11. What new thing does God promise to give us?

Ezekiel 36:26, 27 (NKJV). "26I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you; I will take the heart of stone out of your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. 27I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes, and you will keep My judgments and do them."

12. When is the Christian strongest?

2 Corinthians 12:9, 10 (NKJV). "9 And He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in <u>weakness</u>.' Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me.

¹⁰ Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am <u>weak</u>, then I am strong."

13. What happens to those who are living in Christ?

Romans 8:1 (NKJV). "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit."

14. What changes are seen in a life led by the Spirit?

Galatians 5:22, 23 (NKJV). "22 But the fruit of the Spirit is <u>love</u>, <u>joy</u>, <u>peace</u>, <u>longsuffering</u>, <u>kindness</u>, <u>goodness</u>, <u>faithfulness</u>, 23 <u>gentleness</u>, <u>self-control</u>. Against such there is no law."

15. How does the new life function?

Galatians 2:20 (NKJV). "I have been <u>crucified</u> with <u>Christ</u>; it is no longer I who live, but <u>Christ lives in me</u>; and the *life* which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me."

1. What is the source of spiritual life in the hearts of people? (Paragraph 2).

"So it is only through the life from God that spiritual life is begotten in the hearts of men."

2. What must happen in order for you to partake of this spiritual life? (2).

"Unless a man is 'born from above,' he cannot become a partaker of the life which Christ came to give. John 3:3, margin."

3. What are we not able to secure by anxiety or effort of ourselves? (3).

"The child cannot, by any anxiety or power of its own, add to its stature. No more can you, by anxiety or effort of yourself, secure spiritual growth."

4. What wrong idea do some people have, and what do they do regarding it? (7)

"Many have an idea that they must do some part of the work alone. They have trusted in Christ for the forgiveness of sin, but now they seek by their own efforts to live aright."

5. How are we to grow in grace? (7).

"It is by communion with Him, daily, hourly,—by abiding in Him,—that we are to grow in grace."

6. How are we to abide in Christ? (8).

"Do you ask, 'How am I to abide in Christ?' In the same way as you received Him at first. 'As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in Him.' 'The just shall live by faith.' Colossians 2:6; Hebrews 10:38."

7. What are we to give and take in order to abide in Him? (8).

"By faith you became Christ's, and by faith you are to grow up in Him—by giving and taking. You are to give all,—your heart, your will, your service,—give yourself to Him to obey all His requirements;

and you must *take* all,—Christ, the fullness of all blessing, to abide in your heart, to be your strength, your righteousness, your everlasting helper,—to give you power to obey."

8. What should we do on a daily basis to abide in Him? (9).

"Each morning consecrate yourself to God for that day. Surrender all your plans to Him, to be carried out or given up as His providence shall indicate. Thus day by day you may be giving your life into the hands of God, and thus your life will be molded more and more after the life of Christ."

9. What should our mind dwell upon? (10).

"So you are not to look to yourself, not to let the mind dwell upon self, but look to Christ. Let the mind dwell upon His love, upon the beauty, the perfection, of His character. Christ in His self-denial, Christ in His humiliation, Christ in His purity and holiness, Christ in His matchless love—this is the subject for the soul's contemplation."

10. How are we to be transformed into His likeness? (10).

"It is by loving Him, copying Him, depending wholly upon Him, that you are to be transformed into His likeness."

11. What happens when the mind dwells upon self? (12).

"When the mind dwells upon self, it is turned away from Christ, the source of strength and life."

12. What is Satan's constant effort? (12).

"Hence it is Satan's constant effort to keep the attention diverted from the Saviour and thus prevent the union and communion of the soul with Christ."

13. To what does Satan seek to divert the mind? (12).

"The pleasures of the world, life's cares and perplexities and sorrows, the faults of others, or your own faults and imperfections—to any or all of these he will seek to divert the mind."

14. What often happens to the conscientious? (12).

"Many who are really conscientious, and who desire to live for God, he too often leads to dwell upon their own faults and weaknesses, and thus by separating them from Christ he hopes to gain the victory."

15. Why does Satan constantly present us with allurements? (13).

"Satan will constantly present allurements to induce us to break this tie—to choose to separate ourselves from Christ."

16. What did John see that filled his soul with admiration and love for Christ? (15).

"But as the character of the Divine One was manifested to him, he saw his own deficiency and was humbled by the knowledge. The strength and patience, the power and tenderness, the majesty and meekness, that he beheld in the daily life of the Son of God, filled his soul with admiration and love."

17. What did John lose in love for Christ? (15).

"Day by day his heart was drawn out toward Christ, until he lost sight of self in love for his Master."

18. What power transforms our character? (15).

"The regenerating influence of the Holy Spirit renewed his heart. The power of the love of Christ wrought a transformation of character."

19. What happens when Christ abides in the heart? (15).

"When Christ abides in the heart, the whole nature is transformed."

20. How does Christ abide continually in the hearts of His children, and what are the results? (17).

"Henceforth through the Spirit, Christ was to abide continually in the hearts of His children."

The following person has a high degree of physical activity, and loves to take the roll of leader. She has been very successful at most everything, because of her drive and persistence. She usually accomplishes her goals, by having everyone else conform to her plans. She is struggling unsuccessfully with a particular sin, and has a tendency to get angry and take it out on others. If others try to help, their help is quickly rejected.

She has a hard time admitting that she needs outside help. She feels that if circumstances would only change, she could accomplish the task, and this causes her to be critical and fault-finding. Her approach to character growth has been "just do it." How would you help this self-achiever find the proper way to have victory?

The Great Controversy, p. 555

"It is a law both of the intellectual and the spiritual nature that by beholding we become changed. The mind gradually adapts itself to the subjects upon which it is allowed to dwell. It becomes assimilated to that which it is accustomed to love and reverence. Man will never rise higher than his standard of purity or goodness or truth. If self is his loftiest ideal, he will never attain to anything more exalted.

Rather, he will constantly sink lower and lower. The grace of God alone has power to exalt man. Left to himself, his course must inevitably be downward."
