Chapter 9 The Work and the Life

"In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace."



1. What did Jesus say about His life?

John 17:4 (NKJV). "I have <u>glorified</u> You on the earth. I have <u>finished</u> the <u>work</u> which You have given Me to do."

2. How did the apostle Paul feel about his life's work?

2 Timothy 4:6, 7 (NKJV). "⁶ For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure is at hand. ⁷ I have fought the <u>good fight</u>, I have finished the race, I have <u>kept the faith</u>."

3. What reward awaits those who are victorious?

2 Timothy 4:8 (NKJV). "Finally, there is laid up for me the <u>crown of righteousness</u>, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give to me on that Day, and not to me only but also to all who have loved His appearing."

4. What special gifts has God given for witnessing?

1 Corinthians 12:8-10 (NKJV). "⁸ for to one is given the word of <u>wisdom</u> through the Spirit, to another the word of <u>knowledge</u> through the same Spirit, ⁹ to another <u>faith</u> by the same Spirit, to another gifts of <u>healings</u> by the same Spirit, ¹⁰ to another the working of <u>miracles</u>, to another <u>prophecy</u>, to another <u>discerning</u> of spirits, to another *different* kinds of <u>tongues</u>, to another the <u>interpretation</u> of tongues."

5. What other gifts are mentioned in Romans?

Romans 12:4-8 (NKJV). "⁴ For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, ⁵ so we, *being* many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. ⁶ Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, *let us use them:* if <u>prophecy</u>, *let us prophesy* in proportion to our faith; ⁷ or <u>ministry</u>, *let us use it* in *our* ministering; he who <u>teaches</u>, in teaching; ⁸ he who <u>exhorts</u>, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who <u>leads</u>, with diligence; he who shows <u>mercy</u>, with cheerfulness. not lagging in diligence, fervent in spirit, serving the Lord; ¹² rejoicing in hope, patient in tribulation, continuing steadfastly in <u>prayer</u>; ¹³ <u>distributing</u> to the needs of the saints, given to <u>hospitality</u>."

6. How else are these gifts listed?

Ephesians 4:8, 11 (NKJV). "⁸ Therefore He says: *'When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men.'...*¹¹ And He Himself gave some *to be* <u>apostles</u>, some <u>prophets</u>, some <u>evangelists</u>, and some <u>pastors</u> and <u>teachers</u>,"

7. Why were these gifts given?

Ephesians 4:12, 13 (NKJV). "¹² for the <u>equipping</u> of the saints for the work of <u>ministry</u>, for the <u>edifying</u> of the body of Christ, ¹³ till we all come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to a perfect man, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ;"

8. What was the order of the gifts?

1 Corinthians 12:28 (NKJV). "And God has appointed these in the church: first <u>apostles</u>, second <u>prophets</u>, third <u>teachers</u>, after that <u>miracles</u>, then gifts of <u>healings</u>, <u>helps</u>, <u>administrations</u>, varieties of <u>tongues</u>."

9. What great work do all Christians have?

Matthew 28:19, 20 (NKJV). ^{"19} Go therefore and make <u>disciples</u> of all the nations, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ²⁰ teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and Io, I am with you always, *even* to the end of the age. Amen."

10. What happens when Christians depend on God?

Acts 1:8 (NKJV). "But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be <u>witnesses</u> to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

11. What is God's promise for success?

Isaiah 55:11 (NKJV). "So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall <u>accomplish</u> what I please, And it shall <u>prosper</u> *in the thing* for which I sent it."

 What was the Savior's joy? (Paragraph 2).
 "Our Saviour's joy was in the uplifting and redemption of fallen men."

2. What work are the angels engaged in? (2).

"So angels are ever engaged in working for the happiness of others. This is their joy."

3. What is the spirit that pervades heaven? (2).

"The spirit of Christ's self-sacrificing love is the spirit that pervades heaven and is the very essence of its bliss."

4. How will love to Jesus be manifested? (4).

"Love to Jesus will be manifested in a desire to work as He worked for the blessing and uplifting of humanity."

5. What was the one great object of Christ's life? (5).

"The Saviour's life on earth was not a life of ease and devotion to Himself, but He toiled with persistent, earnest, untiring effort for the salvation of lost mankind."

6. What happens when someone comes to Christ?(6).

"No sooner does one come to Christ than there is born in his heart a desire to make known to others what a precious friend he has found in Jesus; the saving and sanctifying truth cannot be shut up in his heart."

7. What happens when we are filled with the joy of Christ's indwelling Spirit? (6).

"If we are clothed with the righteousness of Christ and are filled with the joy of His indwelling Spirit, we shall not be able to hold our peace."

8. What do we do, and what two things should our witness include? (6).

"Like Philip when he found the Saviour, we shall invite others into His presence. We shall seek to present to them the attractions of Christ and the unseen realities of the world to come."

9. What is the result of the effort to bless others? (7).

"And the effort to bless others will react in blessings upon ourselves."

10. What is the highest honor and greatest joy God can bestow upon us? (7).

"He has granted men the privilege of becoming partakers of the divine nature and, in their turn, of diffusing blessings to their fellow men. This is the highest honor, the greatest joy, that it is possible for God to bestow upon men."

11. What does every act of self-sacrifice do? (9).

"Every act of self-sacrifice for the good of others strengthens the spirit of beneficence in the giver's heart, allying him more closely to the Redeemer of the world,"

12. What does unselfish labor for other produce? (11).

"The spirit of unselfish labor for others gives depth, stability, and Christlike loveliness to the character, and brings peace and happiness to its possessor."

13. Who are most surely working out their own salvation? (11).

"Those who thus devote themselves to unselfish effort for the good of others are most surely working out their own salvation."

14. What is the only way to grow in grace? (12).

"The only way to grow in grace is to be disinterestedly doing the very work which Christ has enjoined upon us--to engage, to the extent of our ability, in helping and blessing those who need the help we can give them."

15. What is God appointed agency for the salvation of men? (13).

"The church of Christ is God's appointed agency for the salvation of men."

16. What would be the result if the followers of Christ were awake to duty? (14).

"If the followers of Christ were awake to duty, there would be thousands where there is one today proclaiming the gospel in heathen lands."

17. Among whom or where can we find a work for God? (15).

"We need not go to heathen lands, or even leave the narrow circle of the home, if it is there that our duty lies, in order to work for Christ. We can do this in the home circle, in the church, among those with whom we associate, and with whom we do business."

18. Why do many find an excuse not to use their gifts? (18).

"Many have excused themselves from rendering their gifts to the service of Christ because others were possessed of superior endowments and advantages."

19. What should we not wait for before we begin to work for God? (20).

"You are not to wait for great occasions or to expect extraordinary abilities before you go to work for God."

20. How should the humble and poor approach their work for God? (21).

"The humblest and poorest of the disciples of Jesus can be a blessing to others. They may not realize that they are doing any special good, but by their unconscious influence they may start waves of blessing that will widen and deepen, and the blessed results they may never know until the day of final reward. They do not feel or know that they are doing anything great. They are not required to weary themselves with anxiety about success. They have only to go forward quietly, doing faithfully the work that God's providence assigns, and their life will not be in vain."
