Chapter 10 A Knowledge of God

Memory Verse – Hebrews 4:15 (NKJV)

"For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all *points* tempted as we are, yet without sin."

1. What should the Christian glory in?

Jeremiah 9:24 (NKJV). "But let him who glories glory in this, That he <u>understands</u> and <u>knows Me</u>, That I am the LORD, exercising lovingkindness, judgment, and righteousness in the earth.
For in these I delight," says the LORD."

2. How do people learn about God?

Matthew 11:27 (NKJV). "All things have been delivered to Me by My Father, and no one knows the Son except the Father. Nor does anyone know the Father except the Son, and *the one* to whom the Son wills to reveal *Him*."

3. Who did Philip want Jesus to reveal?

John 14:8, 9 (NKJV). "8 Philip said to Him, 'Lord, show us the Father, and it is sufficient for us.' ⁹ Jesus said to him, 'Have I been with you so long, and yet you have not known Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the Father; so how can you say, "Show us the Father"?"

4. What do God's created works reveal?

Psalm 19:1 (NKJV). "The heavens declare the glory of God; And the firmament shows His handiwork."

5. What reaction do those have who can see God?

Revelation 4:10, 11 (NKJV). "10 the twenty-four elders fall down before Him who sits on the throne and worship Him who lives forever and ever, and cast their crowns before the throne, saying:

11 'You are worthy, O Lord, To receive glory and honor and power; For You created all things, And by Your will they exist and were created."

6. Where do we begin?

Proverbs 9:10 (NKJV). "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom, And the knowledge of the Holy One is understanding."

7. How can we understand the invisible things of God?

Romans 1:20 (NKJV). "For since the creation of the world His invisible *attributes* are clearly seen, being understood by the <u>things</u> that are <u>made</u>, *even* His eternal power and Godhead, so that they are without excuse,"

8. What happens to those who see these things but refuse to accept them?

Romans 1:22-25 (NKJV). "22 Professing to be wise, they became fools, 23 and changed the glory of the incorruptible God into an image made like corruptible man—and birds and four-footed animals and creeping things.

"24 Therefore God also gave them up to uncleanness, in the lusts of their hearts, to dishonor their bodies among themselves, ²⁵ who exchanged the truth of God for the lie, and worshiped and served the creature rather than the Creator, who is blessed forever. Amen."

9. What description is given of Jesus?

Colossians 2:9 (NKJV). "For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily;"

10. Where can one find eternal life?

John 17:3 (NKJV). "And this is eternal life, that they may know You, the only <u>true</u> <u>God</u>, and <u>Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u> whom You have sent."

11. What knowledge did the Apostle Paul value most of all?

Philippians 3:8 (NKJV). "Yet indeed I also count all things <u>loss</u> for the excellence of the <u>knowledge</u> of <u>Christ Jesus</u> my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ"

12. What do those who know God receive?

Job 22:21 (NKJV). "Now acquaint yourself with Him, and be at peace; Thereby good will come to you."

13. How are some people in the last days described?

2 Timothy 3:7 (NKJV). "Always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth."

14. What principle insures that we will gain a knowledge of the truth?

John 7:17 (NKJV). "If anyone wills to <u>do His will</u>, he shall know concerning the doctrine, whether it is from God or *whether* I speak on My own *authority.*"

1. What is God seeking to do? (Paragraph 1).

"Many are the ways in which God is seeking to make Himself known to us and bring us into communion with Him."

2. With what did Jesus link the words of truth? (2).

"Our Saviour bound up His precious lessons with the things of nature."

3. What beauty does God love most? (3).

"He is a lover of the beautiful, and above all that is outwardly attractive He loves beauty of character; .

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- 4. What would Jesus have us cultivate in our character? (3).
 - "... He would have us cultivate purity and simplicity, the quiet graces of the flowers."

5. What lessons do God's created works teach us? (4).

"If we will but listen, God's created works will teach us precious lessons of obedience and trust."

6. What can be dismissed if we trust God? (5).

"And God cares for everything and sustains everything that He has created. . . . If we would but fully believe this, all undue anxieties would be dismissed."

7. Who enjoys the beauty of the earth with the highest appreciation? (7).

"The poet and the naturalist have many things to say about nature, but it is the Christian who enjoys the beauty of the earth with the highest appreciation, because he recognizes his Father's handiwork and perceives His love in flower and shrub and tree."

8. What other means does God use to speak to us? (8, 9).

"God speaks to us through His providential workings and through the influence of His Spirit upon the heart. . . . God speaks to us in His word."

9. What three things does God reveal in His word? (9).

"Here we have in clearer lines the revelation of His character, of His dealings with men, and the great work of redemption. Here is open before us the history of patriarchs and prophets and other holy men of old."

10. Who does all the Bible tell of? (10).

"Yes, the whole Bible tells of Christ."

11. How do we become acquainted with Jesus? (10).

"If you would become acquainted with the Saviour, study the Holy Scriptures."

12. What gives strength to our spiritual nature? (11).

"Our bodies are built up from what we eat and drink; and as in the natural economy, so in the spiritual economy: it is what we meditate upon that will give tone and strength to our spiritual nature."

13. What will be the science and song of the redeemed throughout eternity? (12).

"The theme of redemption is one that the angels desire to look into; it will be the science and the song of the redeemed throughout the ceaseless ages of eternity."

14. What happens as we contemplate heavenly themes? (12).

"As we thus contemplate heavenly themes, our faith and love will grow stronger, and our prayers will be more and more acceptable to God, because they will be more and more mixed with faith and love."

15. What happens as we meditate upon the perfections of Christ? (13).

"As we meditate upon the perfections of the Saviour, we shall desire to be wholly transformed and renewed in the image of His purity."

16. For whom was the Bible designed? (14).

"The Bible was not written for the scholar alone; on the contrary, it was designed for the common people."

17. What happens if we allow others to do our thinking? (15).

"If we allow others to do our thinking, we shall have crippled energies and contracted abilities."

18. What would we have if God's word were studied as it should be? (16).

"If God's word were studied as it should be, men would have a breadth of mind, a nobility of character, and a stability of purpose rarely seen in these times."

19. What are we to do with our Bible? (17).

"Keep your Bible with you. As you have opportunity, read it; fix the texts in your memory. Even while you are walking the streets you may read a passage and meditate upon it, thus fixing it in the mind."

20. How should we study the Scripture? (18).

"Scripture must be compared with scripture. There must be careful research and prayerful reflection."

21. What should always accompany Bible study? (19).

"Never should the Bible be studied without prayer. Before opening its pages we should ask for the enlightenment of the Holy Spirit, and it will be given."

22. What is the work and office of the Holy Spirit? (20).

"The Holy Spirit exalts and glorifies the Saviour. It is His office to present Christ, the purity of His righteousness, and the great salvation that we have through Him."
