1 Corinthians 10:13 (NKJV). "No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God *is* faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the <u>way of escape</u>, that you may be able to <u>bear *it*</u>."

Titus 2:13 (NKJV). "looking for the <u>blessed hope</u> and glorious appearing of our great God and Savior Jesus Christ,"

Isaiah 26:3 (NKJV). "You will keep *him* in <u>perfect</u> <u>peace</u>, *Whose* mind *is* stayed *on You*, Because he trusts in You."

17. What is the fruit of the Spirit?

Galatians 5:22, 23 (NKJV). "22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law."

1. As a representative of Christ, what should our life show? (Paragraph 1).

"The children of God are called to be representatives of Christ, showing forth the goodness and mercy of the Lord."

2. Christians who gather up gloom and sadness give what? (3).

"Christians who gather up gloom and sadness to their souls, and murmur and complain, are giving to others a false representation of God and the Christian life. They give the impression that God is not pleased to have His children happy, and in this they bear false witness against our heavenly Father."

3. What makes Satan happy? (4).

"Satan is exultant when he can lead the children of God into unbelief and despondency. He delights to see us mistrusting God, doubting His willingness and power to save us. He loves to have us feel that the Lord will do us harm by His providences."

4. What is Satan's work? (4).

"It is the work of Satan to represent the Lord as lacking in compassion and pity. He misstates the truth in regard to Him. He fills the imagination with false ideas concerning God; and instead of dwelling upon the truth in regard to our heavenly Father,

we too often fix our minds upon the misrepresentations of Satan and dishonor God by distrusting Him and murmuring against Him. Satan ever seeks to make the religious life one of gloom."

5. How does Satan seek to make the Christian life appear? (4).

"He desires it to appear toilsome and difficult; and when the Christian presents in his own life this view of religion, he is, through his unbelief, seconding the falsehood of Satan."

6. List one of the five questions asked about joy in our life? (6).

"Have there not been some bright spots in your experience? Have you not had some precious seasons when your heart throbbed with joy in response to the Spirit of God? When you look back into the chapters of your life experience do you not find some pleasant pages?

Are not God's promises, like the fragrant flowers, growing beside your path on every hand? Will you not let their beauty and sweetness fill your heart with joy?"

7. List one of the blessed assurances we should group together and look upon continually. (9).

"Thank God for the bright pictures which He has presented to us. Let us group together the blessed assurances of His love, that we may look upon them continually: The Son of God leaving His Father's throne, clothing His divinity with humanity, that He might rescue man from the power of Satan;

His triumph in our behalf, opening heaven to men, revealing to human vision the presence chamber where the Deity unveils His glory; the fallen race uplifted from the pit of ruin into which sin had plunged it, and brought again into connection with the infinite God, and having endured the divine test through faith in our Redeemer, clothed in the righteousness of Christ, and exalted to His throne—these are the pictures which God would have us contemplate."

8. What happens when we talk out our feelings of doubt? (11).

"All this is harming your own soul; for every word of doubt you utter is inviting Satan's temptations; it is strengthening in you the tendency to doubt, and it is grieving from you the ministering angels."

What should we do when we take the hand of a friend? (12).

"When you take the hand of a friend, let praise to God be on your lips and in your heart. This will attract his thoughts to Jesus."

10. To whom should we relate our troubles? (13).

"All have trials; griefs hard to bear, temptations hard to resist. Do not tell your troubles to your fellow mortals, but carry everything to God in prayer."

11. What rule should we follow regarding doubt? (13).

"Make it a rule never to utter one word of doubt or discouragement."

12. Describe what the life of Jesus was like. (16, 17).

"It is often said that Jesus wept, but that He was never known to smile. Our Saviour was indeed a Man of Sorrows, and acquainted with grief, for He opened His heart to all the woes of men. But though His life was self-denying and shadowed with pain and care, His spirit was not crushed. His countenance did not wear an expression of grief and repining, but ever one of peaceful serenity. His heart was a wellspring of life, and wherever He went He carried rest and peace, joy and gladness.

"Our Saviour was deeply serious and intensely in earnest, but never gloomy or morose."

13. What happens if we keep uppermost in our minds the unkind and unjust acts of others? (18).

"If we keep uppermost in our minds the unkind and unjust acts of others we shall find it impossible to love them as Christ has loved us;

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14. How should we be towards others? (18).

"We should love and respect one another, notwithstanding the faults and imperfections that we cannot help seeing. Humility and self-distrust should be cultivated, and a patient tenderness with the faults of others. This will kill out all narrowing selfishness and make us large-hearted and generous."

15. What are some always doing? (20).

"Some are always fearing, and borrowing trouble. Every day they are surrounded with the tokens of God's love; every day they are enjoying the bounties of His providence; but they overlook these present blessings. Their minds are continually dwelling upon something disagreeable which they fear may come;

or some difficulty may really exist which, though small, blinds their eyes to the many things that demand gratitude."

16. What happens to some who encounter difficulties? (20).

"The difficulties they encounter, instead of driving them to God, the only source of their help, separate them from Him because they awaken unrest and repining."

17. How should we handle business problems? (22).

"You may be perplexed in business; your prospects may grow darker and darker, and you may be threatened with loss; but do not become discouraged; cast your care upon God, and remain calm and cheerful.

Pray for wisdom to manage your affairs with discretion, and thus prevent loss and disaster. Do all you can on your part to bring about favorable results. Jesus has promised His aid, but not apart from our effort. When, relying upon our Helper, you have done all you can, accept the result cheerfully."

18. What is happiness like that is sought from selfish motives? (27).

"Happiness that is sought from selfish motives, outside of the path of duty, is ill-balanced, fitful, and transitory; it passes away, and the soul is filled with loneliness and sorrow; . . ."

19. What mercies should we keep fresh in our memory? (28).

"Let us keep fresh in our memory all the tender mercies that God has shown us,--the tears He has wiped away, the pains He has soothed, the anxieties removed, the fears dispelled, the wants supplied, the blessings bestowed,— thus strengthening ourselves for all that is before us through the remainder of our pilgrimage."

20. What is of surpassing worth? (32).

"The soul redeemed and cleansed from sin, with all its noble powers dedicated to the service of God, is of surpassing worth; and there is joy in heaven in the presence of God and the holy angels over one soul redeemed, a joy that is expressed in songs of holy triumph."
